





Mini-Grant Application

The Chatham County Partnership for Children, local host agency for the Raising A Reader program, is offering early childhood professionals and their schools an opportunity to strengthen their families' engagement in "book cuddling" with children from birth-Kindergarten. The program addresses a national crisis: one in three children enters kindergarten lacking basic pre-reading skills.

The Goal

Raising A Reader is designed to serve young children in environments where poverty, language barriers, limited formal education for parents, and other issues create challenges to regular book sharing. The goal is to substantially increase the number of families that frequently and routinely share picture books with their infant and preschool children.

You're Role

Raising A Reader is fun and easy to use. We invite professionals to rotate bright red book bags filled with award-winning, beautiful picture books into their children's homes. We train these providers to teach "read-aloud" strategies to parents.

When this multicultural, multilingual program is fully embraced; evaluations demonstrate parents reading to their children frequently and children entering kindergarten at twice the readiness of children from similar backgrounds who did not participate in Raising A Reader.

The Process

The following mini-grant application is designed to identify those early childhood programs who are most passionate about bringing Raising A Reader to their families and who demonstrate a commitment to sustaining the program over time. The winners of these grants will participate in the Raising A Reader program, including training and use of program materials.

- 1. Make the RAR program a central part of your curriculum. Share RAR books with children at school and they will share them with their families at home. Teach care of the materials so book bag kits last 5-7 years.
- 2. Introduce the program to your children, families and staff as taught at your first implementer training, the Kickoff Orientation.
- 3. Attend two RAR implementer trainings each year. Learn new strategies. Discuss relevant research.
- 4. Carefully manage the book bag check-out system and care of the books.
- 5. Offer at least two family literacy gatherings to develop caregivers' book sharing skills.
- 6. Work with Chatham County Partnership for Children to connect participating families to the library.
