- A child's home environment has a very big influence on their development
- There are thousands of children waiting to be adopted into a loving home
- In North Carolina a single person or married couple can be an adoptive family
- You must be 18 years old to adopt and 21 years old to foster
- You do not have to own a home or have a certain amount of income to be a foster or adoptive parent
- *You do not have to be perfect to be a perfect parent!*

General Information and Tips

Job loss or unemployment do not only affect family income, but family stability and child development as well.

- Can strain familial relationships and cause stress depression, and substance use
- Can have negative effects on children's academic achievement, behavior in school and college aspirations
 - Lower test scores
 - More school suspensions
 - Grade repetition
 - Low college attendance
 - Lower adult earnings
- Can cause families to have little access to nutritious foods and enriching resources
- Can cause lower life satisfaction from the family, including children later in life

Child care and early education can have effects on children's emotional, social, and academic development. The first few years of a child's life are crucial to their brain development so it is important that children have positive, meaningful experiences while in care.

High quality programs tend to have:

- Developmentally appropriate activities
- Low adult-to-child ratios
- Well-educated and consistent caregivers
- Established routines
- Regular parent involvement

Young children in high-quality programs tend to:

- Have better language skills
- Have more developed reasoning abilities
- Perform better on math and language tests in elementary school
- Have better social skills
- Be happier overall

Crime and Violence

General Information and Tips

Almost 40% of American children were direct victims of 2 or more violent acts. Children are more likely to be exposed to violence and crime than adults.

Children exposed to violence may have the following outcomes:

- Psychological health problems such as depression, PTSD, anxiety, and fear
- Negative effects on brain development and cognition
- Higher risk for physical injury and poor overall health
- Risk for self-injury or suicide
- Academic difficulties or failure
- Behavioral problems such as substance use, delinquency, and violence.

When should my child have well-child check-ups and shots?

It's important for children to attend all well-child visits and keep their vaccinations up to date. Talk to your doctor if you are concerned about your child's developmental abilities and/or growth. Developmental screenings should be given at all well-child visits and help keep track of your child's milestones.
